FOREWORDS

It is my pleasure to share the Annual Progress Report 2016/017 s of Ashal Chhimeki Nepal (ACN) to respective stakeholders. The report replicates the accomplished activities in the previous fiscal year implemented based on the community development approach as well as different multidonor projects like Livelihood Rehabilitation Project, the Improvement Agriculture Products for Poor Households in Gorkha and Sindhupalchwok District, The Livelihood Improvement for Women in Barpak VDC of Gorkha District, Maternal and Child Health Care Program (MCHP) in Gandaki Gaupalika Ward No 1, Makaising, Gorkha, Open Defecation Free Campaign Project in Morang District and District NGO Capacity Building for Recovery and Resilience in Sindhupalchwok District, Community Empowerment through Mom Center Project . Based on the project modality, program and designed activities, the report highlighted the major progress in line with indicators based thematic areas output with immediate result of the activities.

Regarding different areas of intervention, in case of the education, since, 2008 we have been working in Humla district and performing different activities especially education related so as of recent intervention is about educational materials distribution. For instance, School bag, Uniform and stationeries etc. 1689 school children benefited by educational materials. In which, male participants 810 and female are 879 respectively. Similarly, education related activities have been conducted in two districts (Kailali and Bardiya) as community empowerment through Mom Center project. Regarding Bardiya district, we performed ECD program with having 25 children and also continuation of Library with 180 people participated. Similarly, ECD program with having 52 children and 506 people participated in Library with in this fiscal year. .

In relation to MCHP, 2307 population are targeted as of 1094 Male and 1213 Female. Except this, about 1500 population other adjoining rural municipalities that directly benefited through this project. In which, we have conducted different activities such as fourteen numbers of medical equipments (Ultra sound, NST Machine, Doppler, warmer etc) supported to PHCC of Makaising during this project intervention period. Likewise, 14 different items of Non Medical equipments supported such as Generator, Visitor chair, TV, Internet etc. Apart from this, we have conducted capacity building trainings like USG for PHCC staffs, Health education classes, training on Nutritional food etc. We have also distributed some nutrition foods for 150 pregnant women like Lito, Satu and Egg for one month period of time. Lastly, we also did some promotional activities such as Book, DVD, and Pump plate etc.

In the livelihood rehabilitation project, 4991 community people has benefited through different activities such as vocational trainings (Plumbing, Tailoring, House wiring, Cooking, Driving, Mobile Repairing and Beautician). In which, 230 people participated with having male 144 and 86 female respectively. Similarly, other activities like income generation through cash support, entrepreneurship training to poor business people and focusing on building resilient livelihood and agriculture, food security and nutrition.

In relation to improvement agriculture products for poor households in Gorkha and Sindhupalchwok districts. Regarding Sindhupalchwok, 645 households were benefited with having 199 male and 446 female through this project. In which, 270 people were trained on vegetable farming and supports also like Seed (vegetables), Fertilizer (DAP Urea) and Materials/goods, Plastic sheet, fungicide/pesticide Support. Similarly, 225 people were trained on Maize farming and Seed (Maize) and fertilizer (DAP, Urea) support. Likewise, 50 people directly benefited through Quality Seed Production related trainings, 50 people benefited from Paddy quality seed trainings, 25 people on wheat and 25 people on potato respectively.

Regarding Gorkha district, 450 households were benefited with having 360 female and 90 male through this project. In which, major achievement are increased 38.3% increment on vegetable production ranging from 2015 to 2016. Such as, winter vegetables was 147.7 kg/hh but in 2016, 202 kg/hh. Similarly, 69.44 % increment on summer vegetables farming ranging from 2015 to 2016. Other achievement are winter and summer vegetables training for 225 peoples as well as maize farming training and also supported like bucket, jug, gloves, Plastic sheet for compost manure, seeds and fertilizer to all targeted beneficiaries i.e. 225 people from project areas.

In relation to The Livelihood Improvement for Women in Barpak VDC of Gorkha District, 403 households were benefited with having 403 women only. In which, the major achievement was Women Cooperative Establishment with 405 members in it. Likewise, 165 She goats and 11 He goats supported and also people perception changed as of vegetable farming which was not well before this program launched. There were also different capacity building related trainings provided especially focused on cooperative, goat and vegetable farming.

In relation to ODF campaign project, 7646 HHs were benefited from this project. In which, till this fiscal year, we have completed some important activities like five days residential triggering training for ten staffs of GNN, event celebration, hand washing demonstration, promotion of sanitation and hygiene behaviors, formation of M/W-WASH-CC in both Municipalities namely Ratuwamai Municipality and Sunbarsi Municipality, task force formation and also orientation to them. Similarly, child club formation and household visit and follow up. Till now 274 toilets has been constructed out of 7646 HHs.

I would like to thanks all the community people, community level, district level & central level line agencies and like-minded organization for the coordination and collaboration in course of PCM. I would also like to extend my sincere thanks to the funding partner especially Good Neighbors International (GNI), JICA, WVI, RCI, UNHABITAT s for frequent monitoring and technical support to ease the implementation processes. I expect the continuity of support from all the stakeholders in upcoming days along with incorporating the lesson learning in coming days.

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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

With the goal of community development different programs were carried out in proportion to the different projects in the fiscal year 2016/017. In this regard, about 41,300 people were benefited with different projects on a beneficiary basis like ODF campaign project, agriculture improvement, livelihood rehabilitation etc.

With the aid of JICA, we were able to perform a livelihood project especially as a Quick Response for earthquake-affected people in Gorkha and Sindhupalchok. The main objectives were improvement of vegetable farming practices and livestock support for women groups, improvement of maize farming practices for poor farmers and improvement of the production of quality seeds. In relation to improvement of agriculture products for poor households in Gorkha and Sindhupalchok districts. Regarding Sindhupalchok, 645 households were benefited with having 199 males and 446 females through this project. In which, 270 people were trained on vegetable farming and supports also like Seed (vegetables), Fertilizer (DAP Urea) and Materials/goods, Plastic sheet, fungicide/pesticide Support. Similarly, 225 people were trained on Maize farming and Seed (Maize) and fertilizer (DAP, Urea) support. Likewise, 50 people directly benefited through Quality Seed Production related trainings, 50 people benefited from Paddy quality seed trainings, 25 people on wheat and 25 people on potato respectively.

Regarding Gorkha district, 450 households were benefited with having 360 females and 90 males through this project. In which, major achievements are increased 38.3% increment on vegetable production

ranging from 2015 to 2016. Such as, winter vegetables were 147.7 kg/hh but in 2016, 202 kg/hh. Similarly, 69.44% increment on summer vegetables farming ranging from 2015 to 2016. With the funding of World Vision International (WVI), we were able to perform some activities with the aim of rehabilitation of post-disaster situation of the community people. As per this, in the livelihood rehabilitation project, 4,991 community people have benefited through different activities such as vocational trainings (Plumbing, Tailoring, House

wiring, Cooking, Driving, Mobile Repairing and Beautician). In which, 230 people participated with having male 144 and 86 female respectively. Similarly, other activities like income generation through cash support, entrepreneurship training to poor business people and focusing on building resilient livelihood and agriculture, food security and nutrition.

With the funding of Rose Club International (RCI), we able to perform different activities with the general objectives to improve the health status of women especially on maternal health care in Gandkai Gaupalika ward no. 1, Makaising, Gorkha, Nepal. As per this, In relation to MCHP, 2307 population are targeted as of 1094 Male and 1213 Female. Except this, about 1500 population other adjoining rural municipalities were directly benefited through this project. In which, we have conducted different activities such as fourteen numbers of medical equipments (Ultra sound, NST Machine, Doppler, warmer etc) supported to PHCC of Makaising during this project intervention period. Likewise, 14 different items of Non Medical equipments supported such as Generator, Visitor chair, TV, Internet etc. Apart from this, we have conducted capacity building trainings like USG for PHCC staffs, Health education classes, training on Nutritional food etc. We have also distributed some nutrition foods for 150 pregnant women like Lito, Satu and Egg for one month period of time. Lastly,

we also did some promotional activities such as Book, DVD, and Pump plate etc.

With the Aid of UNHABITAT, We have conducted different activities within this fiscal year with objective like to build the capacity of D-WASH-CC, V-WASH-CCs and stakeholders, to support in formulation district and VDC level strategic plans, to bring behavioral changes in school and communities for hand washing with soap, sustainable use of toilets and adoption of proper hygiene behaviors and to strengthen monitoring and knowledge management systems. As per this, In relation to ODF campaign project, 7646 HHs were benefited from this project. In which, till this fiscal year, we have completed some important activities like five days residential triggering training for ten staffs of GNN, event celebration, hand washing demonstration, promotion of sanitation and hygiene behaviors, formation of M/W-WASH-CC in both Municipalities namely Ratuwamai Municipality and Sunbarsi Municipality, task force formation and also orientation to them. Similarly, child club formation and household visit and follow up. Till now 274 toilets has been constructed out of 7646 HHs.

In summary, the activities were conducted as per the project based objectives and indicators with the aim of community development in the participation and involvement of the community people.

BACKGROUND

Ashal Chhimeki Nepal-ACN (Good Neighbors Nepal-GNN) was established in 2002 in Kathmandu, Nepal with the aim of transforming the community for the sustainable development holistically. The major areas of interventions are education, health, sanitation & WASH, income generations & vocational education, network building and partnerships, emergency response, and advocacy. The activities are achieved based on the yearly plan of the 5 years agreement with Good Neighbors International (GNI). However, the major funding agency is GNI. The report replicates the performed activities in 7 districts through different project based with thematic area such as livelihood, Wash, Health and Education etc. The on-going districts are Morang, Gorkha, Sindhupalchwok, Kathmandu, Lalitpur, Gorkha, Mugu and Humla.

The respective projects are executed by the respective district offices of the organizations in coordination with respective line agencies: District Coordination Committee (DCC), District Education Office (DEO), District Agriculture Development Office, District Livelihood Service Office (DLSO), District Women and Child Office (DWCO), District Child Welfare Board (DCWB), District Administrative Office (DAO), District Public Health Office (DPHO), and District Forest Office (DFO) and so on along the coordination with like-minded organizations of the respective districts.

Based on the organizational goal the projects' goals are set to scaffold the community people with the focus to their improvement and MDGs goal of the United Nation Organization (UNO).

In this regards, the organization has focused according to project goal and objective in line with organizational VMO so, firstly especially focus to Sangla for marginalized groups while in case of Lalitpur Pahari ethnic community are focused as a target group and Godawari, Badikhel, Chapagaun, Jharuwarasi, Lele, Devichaur and Nallu are the concerned .

In case of Gorkha, 6 VDCs are covered in this district with especial focus to ethnic groups especially Magar and Gurung and poor people of the communities in line with Western Region. while in Karnali region the organization work in Mugu and Humla as a geographically and economically marginalized community. Likewise, we also focused earthquake affected family in both Gorkha and Sindhupalchwok starting from early response to post disaster period and ongoing.

Regarding the human resources there are 70 staffs among them 45 male and rest of them are female staffs. In which, 4 personnel are Dalit and other 5 personnel are volunteer working staffs.

The report replicates the activities executed from July 15, 2016 to July 15, 2017 or the fiscal year 2073/74 BS..

PROJECTS

During this fiscal year, the organization has completed the activities as targeted in project wise as mention above. The activities were in line with all projects: The projects are focused on the integrated development of the community for the sustainability of them along with improving the livelihood through livelihood activities and accessing the approach of children at school through educational support along with sensitization in health, hygiene, and education in coordination with district level and community level agencies and Community Based Organizations (CBOs), that is, child club, youth club, farmers' group, mother group and parents groups, saving groups and cooperatives. However, education, health, WASH and livelihood improvement are the major thematic area where the activities with special focus to each area beneficiaries of different projects. Here are below in briefs of different projects activities and achievements.

1. Livelihood Rehabilitation Project:

In the livelihood rehabilitation project, 4991 community people has benefited through different activities such as vocational trainings (Plumbing, Tailoring, House wiring, Cooking, Driving, Mobile Repairing and Beautician).

In which, 230 people participated with having male 144 and 86 female respectively. Similarly, other activities like income generation through cash support, entrepreneurship training to poor business people and focusing on building resilient livelihood and agriculture, food security and nutrition (For detail, see annex table No 1).





2. The Improvement Agriculture Products for Poor Households in Gorkha and Sindhupalchwok District

Sincere, hard work & labor lead everyone in the ways to fulfill fundamental requirement. There are so many examples which proved the person with the labor, hardworking & obedience one day getting the sweet result of their hard-working. Here, we are going to discuss about the Chini Maya Tamang, who is also one of the sincere, laborious & hard working women from Irkhu VDC-4, Sindhupalchwok. Since, her childhood, she did not get such facility for study & she engaged in the agricultural work basically, helping in kitchen garden for vegetable production. Later on after her marry and having family, her husband had to go abroad (India) for earning money. But, the earning could not meet the family requirement sufficiently, by which his husband returned back to the village taking the hope for doing something on his own country & own field. The circumstances become more favored for him because he knew that, Good Neighbors Nepal have been working in his village for the support of the vegetable farming techniques. Just immediately, by knowing this, he did not delayed to involve his wife (Chini Maya Tamang) to become a member of targeted women group & taking the training provided by GNN for the vegetable farming technology.

Chini Maya Tamang took the aim from the joining time of the program by Good Neighbors Nepal that, she anyhow take the knowledge, skill & technology of vegetable farming & will actively engaged in the work for additional support of her 4 members of family. Exactly, what she thought, the situation became same, she got the seeds of summer & winter

vegetable training & used the technology laboriously which she learned in the training & she could success to get the chance of producing more 7 more healthy & fresh vegetable & also sold them to market as well. She became the best farmer of the women group who also proved that, if someone have faith, sincere & working capacity, that person not only successful for herself but also become the example for his/her whole society. Specially, she also initiate in the village of that Tamang community that, they



should have the kitchen garden & produce fresh vegetable for their health as well as income. Nowadays, in addition to her family healthiness, the vegetables from her kitchen garden also becoming the source of income, which proved that for making standard life of family, they may not compulsion of going abroad to earn money.

Nowadays, she used to say that, this success is not only the effort of me, but also the effort & support by Good Neighbors Nepal. Now, she is planning to extend the vegetable farming up to 2 ropanis & convert it on the commercial vegetable farming.



3. Community Empowerment through Mom Center Project

In case of the education, since, 2008 we have been working in Humla district and performing different activities especially education related so as of recent intervention is about educational materials distribution. For instance, School bag, Uniform and stationeries etc. 1689 school children were benefited by educational materials. In which, male participants 810 and female are 879 respectively. Similarly, education related activities have been conducted in two districts (Kailali and Bardiya) as community empowerment through Mom Center project.

Regarding Bardiya district, we performed ECD program with having 25 children and also continuation of Library with 180 people participated. Similarly, ECD program with having 52 children and 506 people participated in Library with in this fiscal year. (For detail, see annex table No 3).



IF YOU STRIVE; YOU COULD SUCCEED

Diligence, perseverance, and devotion leads everyone to the road of the success. If we peer in our society, we get numerous examples of peoples who were able to bring commendable results through their industriousness and hard working. Here, we are going to discuss about life changing story of “Kopila Ghale”, who is ingenuous, sedulous and devoted woman, from Sulikot-2, Barpak, Gorkha District. She passed her SLC and +2 from Shree Himalaya Secondary School, Sulikot-1, Barpak (former Barpak-4). After she got married, she could not perpetuate her study because of household chores, and her dreams to do something in life came to dead-end. She became busy in feeding her five member family, washing clothes and providing hand in seasonal farming. Despite these entire rigors, she never stopped seeking the opportunities. “If you want something so badly, whole universe conspires in helping you to achieve it”. The same things happen in Kopila Ghale’s life, when Good Neighbors Nepal launched the project, “Livelihood improvement of women in Barpak VDC” in Barpak, Gorkha District.

Under this project, three sub-projects- improvement of vegetable farming practices for women in Barpak VDC, Livelihood improvement through Goat farming for women in Barpak VDC, Establishment and enhancement of women’s cooperative in Barpak VDC- were starting in Barpak VDC. When she heard about this project, she, immediately, became the member of targeted women groups (vegetable farming) and took the privilege of training provided the Good Neighbors Nepal. There were only women’s groups in Barpak, not women’s cooperative, before the project launched by GNN. During our ward visit, for establishment of women’s cooperative, we came to know that Kopila Ghale, one of targeted women of vegetable farming, was also engaged in women’s group in

her society, and was also the chairperson of that women’s group. We find that she was work devoted, phlegmatic, and vivacious; the only thing wanting in her life was opportunity. After seeing her enthusiasm and work commitment, she was selected in the ad-hoc committee for establishment and registration of the women’s cooperative.

After the registration, she was selected as the secretary of the women’s cooperative from the first preliminary assembly because of her hard work and sincerity. She not only manages time for cooperative but also for her family and vegetable farming. She has grown



the different pre-summer and summer vegetables from the seeds she got from the GNN. She has also sold the surplus vegetables in nearby market. She became best farmer of the women’s group in her ward. Kopila Ghale, who once was busy in household drudgery, is now secretary as well as Administrator of women’s cooperative and a progressive farmer, and become epitome of progressive women in the society. In present days, she says that if there is will, there’s a way to achieve it. If GNN was not here, then she will not get such type of momentous opportunity to hone her abilities and skills. In near future, she is planning to engage her whole life in welfare and expansion of the cooperative and lead cooperative in summit of success as well as extending her kitchen garden to commercial farming.

4. The Livelihood Improvement for Women in Barpak VDC of Gorkha District

In relation to The Livelihood Improvement for Women in Barpak VDC of Gorkha District, 403 households were benefited with having 403 women only. In which, the major achievement was Women Cooperative Establishment with 405 members in it.



Likewise, 165 She goats and 11 He goats supported and also people perception changed as of vegetable farming which was not well before this program launched. There were also different capacity building related trainings provided especially focused on cooperative, goat and vegetable farming. (For detail, see annex table No 4).

Mrs. Sabita Adhikari Shrestha, married women living in Gaikhur, Gorkha with her husband with joint family. She belongs from low income family and looking for employment and source of economy to sustain their family better. Furthermore, As of an earthquake affected victim and poor vulnerable household, she was selected as a beneficiary for parlor training in the earthquake response program during the recovery phase after livelihood rehabilitation project got in effect in Gorkha district. After this, she completed parlor training successfully.

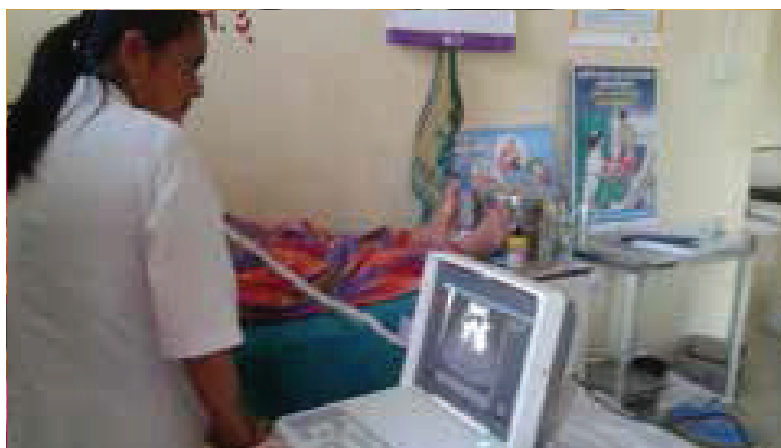
Now, she is became a beautician trainer for her further career. After some time just after this training, Beautician trainee Mrs. Sabita Adhikari Shrestha had set-up beauty parlor into own home i.e. Gaikhur, Gorkha before 15 days by investing rs. 40000.00 Approximately. In average four to five people are taking service from her parlor and taking services. From the set- up of business, it supports her to update knowledge and gain practical ideas as well as opportunity of employment. She has been receiving approximately rs. 500.00 profit each day from the parlor which also supporting to her livelihood.

In which, we have conducted different activities such as fourteen numbers of medical equipments (Ultra sound, NST Machine, Doppler, warmer etc) supported to PHCC of Makaising during this project



intervention period. Likewise, 14 different items of Non Medical equipments supported such as Generator, Visitor chair, TV, Internet etc. Apart from this, we have conducted capacity building trainings like USG for PHCC staffs, Health education classes, training on Nutritional food etc. We have also distributed some nutrition foods for 150 pregnant women like Lito, Satu and Egg for one month period of time. Lastly, we also did some promotional activities such as Book, DVD, and Pump plate etc. (For detail, see annex table No 5).

NUTRITION FOOD DISTRIBUTION



The nutrition food distribution program was starting from February 2017. The program was targeting to pregnant women of Gandaki Rural Municipality, Gorkha. Distribution is done every once a month basis. In four time, it was distributed the nutritional food items to 50 targeting women from Gandaki Municipality base on pregnancy Identity cards and recommendation from respective PHCC and Health Post (HP). The nutritional foods were distributed through Makaising PHCC.

This is the story from Makaising one of our working VDCs having 416 HHs with 2231 population. Most of the people in the village are daily paid laborers and are engaged in agriculture which is the only source of economy and living. Lack of drinking water facility, poor hygiene and lack of nutritional food in this community. We are going to discuss about the nutrition food with Mrs.

Hira Shrestha, she is an ordinary woman now Makaising-1 Gorkha. She did not get much facility for study and also had to suffered early child marriage. She is a mother of one son and two daughters; her elder daughter is studying class two. Her husband had no job and is out of country in seeking of Job opportunity. She is the one to look after the family of 5 members. She has pregnant before six month and has not have supplementary nutritional food in her house before. And now Good Neighbors Nepal has been giving nutritional food. She told I am eating nutrition food four times of day. So, that physically and mentally well-being is in my health. Now Mrs.Hira Shrestha's health condition is normal.

Recognize the link between past and present nutritional status and its effect on maternal health and fetal growth and a successful birth outcome.

6. Open Defecation Free Campaign Project in Morang District

In relation to ODF campaign project, 7646 HHs were benefited from this project. In which, till this fiscal year, we have completed some important activities like five days residential triggering training for ten staffs of GNN, event celebration, hand washing demonstration, promotion of sanitation and hygiene behaviors, formation of M/W-WASH-CC in both Municipalities namely Ratuwamai Municipality and Sunbarsi Municipality, task force formation and also orientation to them. Similarly, child club formation and household visit and follow up. Till now 274 toilets has been constructed out of 7646 HHs. (For detail, see annex table No 6).

This case study replicates the footstep towards ODF. This is the story from Mahadewa one of our working VDCs having 1176 HHs with 5647 population, situated near coast of Ratuwamai sea. Most of the people in the village are daily paid laborers and are engaged in agriculture which is the only source of economy and living. The village living has been highly affected by the sea. And lack of drinking water facility, poor hygiene due to open defecation and lack of waste disposal system adds on it. Initially our staffs faced lot of resistance and non cooperation from different sections of community, but they are engaged in convincing the mass through different sanitation awareness related activities. Today we are going to recount on Mrs. Jamuna Shah, who is an ordinary woman from Pidali, then Mahadewa-1 now Ratuwamai-3, Morang. She did not get much facility for study and also had to suffered early child marriage. She is a mother of one son and four daughters, her elder daughter is married. Her husband had no job and is out of country in seeking of Job opportunity. She is the one to look after the family of 4 members. She does not have toilet facility in her house before. And a mother of 5 along with their children used to practice open defecation. But it was quit harder for her 13 yrs old physically challenged son Rajin Shah who is borne with walking and speaking disability. Mrs. Shah shared -remembering life before toilet construction, we mother and daughter used to go in the fields far away from living areas in the fields but my

son used to defecate nearby only. Neighbors used to scold him and urged me to send him in fields. We always fear being seen going for defecation in fields. It was very inconvenient with younger daughters when it was raining or during the night. I had to accompany my daughters leaving my son home alone. Before I don't know that practicing open defecation has all these consequences including making one disabled. But the most important thing I don't want to see other suffer because of us. I know the pain how it feels when you have a disable child in your family and you know that how difficult is life for him/her. Thanks to GNN/NBS ODF Campaign team for making us realize. And we constructed a temporary toilet. Now the life has totally changed and become much easier after the toilet construction. My son and daughters are very happy. I feel I got relieve from my guilt. Being alone caretaker of my family, now I feel safe and satisfied. And from now onwards I will make my neighbors aware regarding consequences of open defecation. RajinShah a 13 years old boy shared saying- I am able to walk hardly hence was unable to take water along with me for washing purpose. Mostly I had to wait for my sisters to help me with washing and all. But now I don't have to walk for a long hurting my leg or wait for my sisters to come. I manage myself and feel like now I don't have to bother them all the time. Thanks to Lalita and Sharmila Sister who made us realize how we were putting others life in danger as well by practicing defecation in open.

EDUCATION



Early Childhood Development Center (ECDC) is focus on formal education of children, school infra and education materials to ease our level of understanding. The ECDC as an important part to boost up the children's holistic development and creating the environment for accessibility of children in education as a milestone. For the effectiveness of ECDC classroom, 115 ECD got required materials along with software support while one ECD building constructed in projected area. ECD sector by the backdrop that development opportunities for rural development abound under Kailali and Bardiya Education System, yet majority of the rural communities lack development due to their inability to utilize them. With over fifteen years of community service, the organization has grown from

a community-based organization to a non-profit NGO, operating in the thematic areas of education, human rights and environment. It seeks to create a future of hope for under-served children, women and their communities by helping them to build their skills and resources to reduce their vulnerability in a sustainable way.

The kailali and Bardiya Mom centers operate with eighteen staffs, comprising two full-time, two part-time workers and 5 volunteers. It also provides opportunity for community volunteers and students on internship to learn and participate in its activities. The directly benefited children are 2300. Regarding material development training and parental education re the major software part for the ECDC program.

LESSON LEARNS

As per the action plan for implementation of the activities, the activities were implemented in line with agreed project modality. In course of implementation of the program in the community the following lessons were learned:

- Increase the coordination with governmental line agencies to reduce the duplication and use of the resources in relation to efficiency and economic aspect.
- Develop the network with likeminded organization to share the learning and resources opportunities in course of project cycle management.
- The income generation program is to be designed based on the interest and capacity of the farmers along with identification of the market linkages.
- The procurement of the goods is to be done by community with special observation from implementing partner for reducing the lateness and building ownership in infra.
- Updating the base values for result base management in coordination with district level line agencies and Rural Municipality level line agencies.
- Proper planning, mobilization and control of work during post earth quake rehabilitation phase as well as regular operation.



Opportunities and Challenges

While implementing the activities in the community, the following opportunities and challenges were short outs:

Opportunities:

The lists of opportunities are as mentioned below:

- Working with diverse communities with different aspects of the people as thematic area wise like WASH, Health, Livelihood and Education in respective working areas.
- Coordination and collaboration with line agencies for the effective, efficient and economic use of limited resources to maximize the result.
- Making the co-operative for entry point to farmers and empowering women by livelihood means.
- Community people participation is highly encouraged for the implementation of the activities timely.
- Working even after disaster as post earthquake especially Gorkha and Sindhupalchwok district.

- Working experience in different areas like DRR, Resilience, MCHP etc and also big budget project.

- Working with different donors at a one time as like a Multi Donor Approach.

Challenges:

The lists of challenges are as mentioned below:

- Remote area with frequency of landslides, heavy rain fall that somehow make difficulties while conducting activities and also impacting Floods in Terai areas.
- Similar types of program by the line agencies and like-minded organization may result in duplication.
- High the expectation of the community people to mitigate their needs.
- Zero subsidy related activities like ODF that compiling big challenge for entertain.
- Identification of the real need of the community and resource allocation to meet the target.
- Short period and time bounded project are challenging for the completion in right time.

CONCLUSION

The activities are implemented according to plan of action of respective projects for fiscal year 2016/17 based on Project Agreement with Donor organizations.

During this fiscal year, we have been conducting different six projects. In which, the big one is livelihood according to budget as well as activities in large scale with like DRR, Vocational, Irrigation etc. Such type of intervention gives us breakthrough in high level experiences in different sectors.

In this time, we have achieved and experienced on single thematic area like women empowerment project in Barpak of earth quake epi-center of Nepal. In which, it gives new horizon for the future endeavor.

To improve the family condition, the

livelihood related activities were designed in line with national priorities based on the group and cooperative modality along with supporting in business plan and linking them in district level governmental agencies.

We able to make different publication (Vegetable farming, Wheat farming, Maize farming, MNCH related) regarding livelihood, health and advocacy for the betterment of community people living standard.

Improvement and establishment of different cooperatives enable poor community people empowerment. We able to perform different thematic areas from different projects based within this fiscal year like WASH, Livelihood, Health, Women Empowerment, DRR, Cooperatives etc.

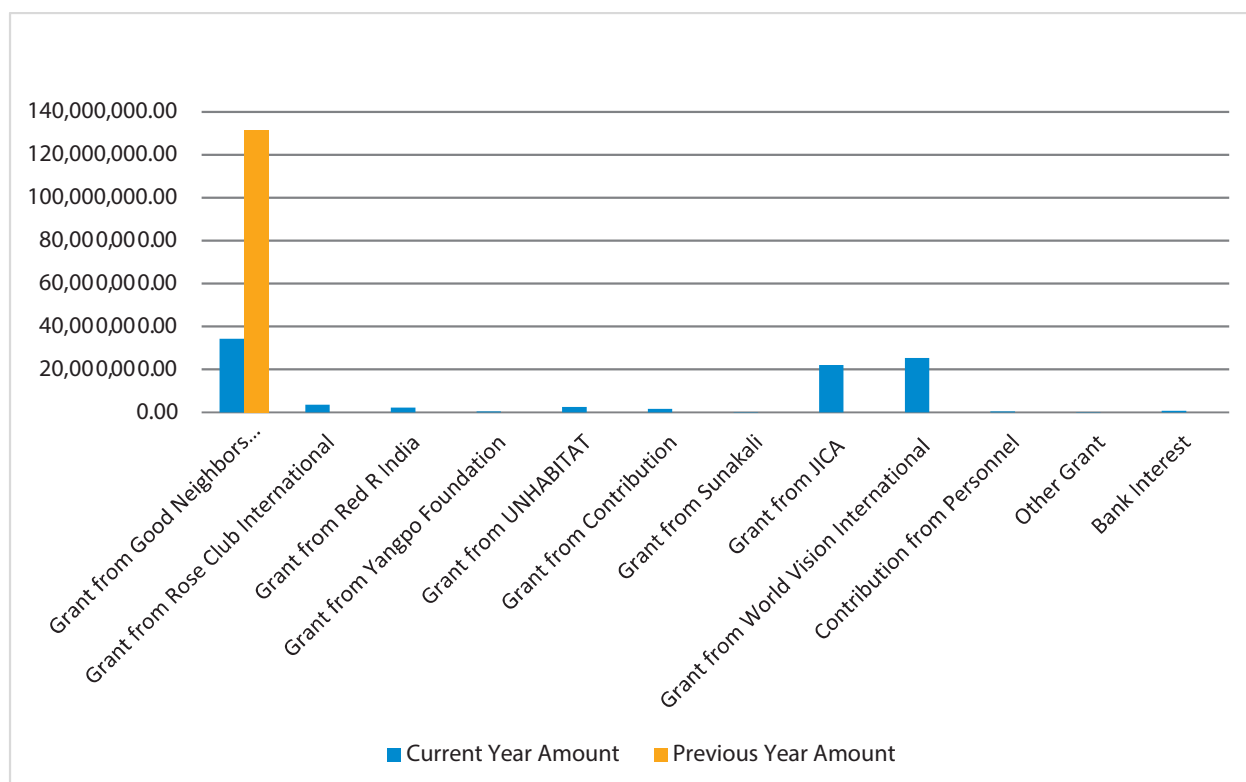

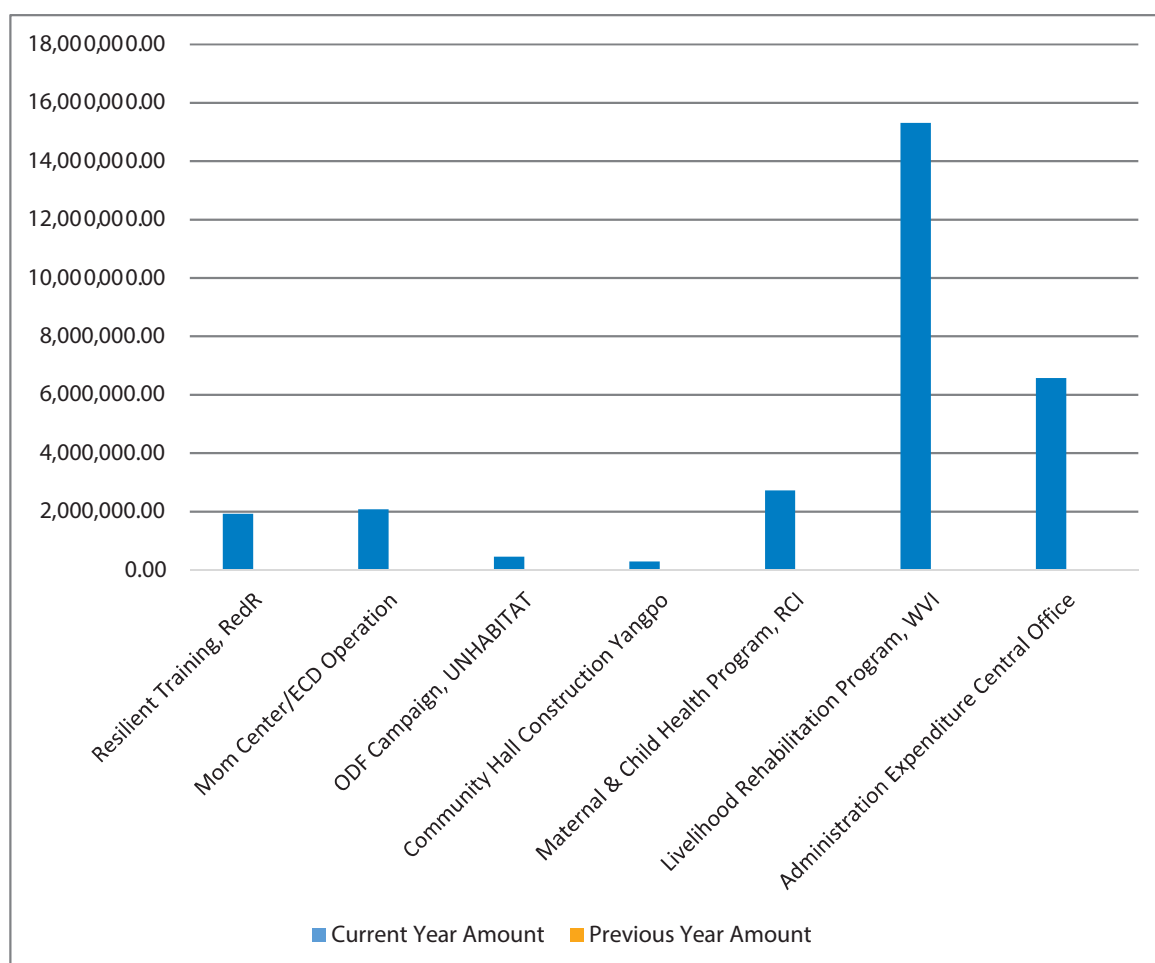
